

Visiting Assistant Teaching professor in Italian Language and Culture

The Department of Romance Languages and Literatures at the University of Notre Dame is seeking to appoint a full-time, Visiting Assistant Teaching Professor in Italian Language and Culture in a dynamic undergraduate program committed to innovation and teaching excellence. This is a one-year appointment with the possibility of renewal to begin in August 2025. The number of teaching hours will depend on enrollments, but normal teaching load will be 3/3 (9/9 credit hours).

Qualifications

Native or near-native proficiency in Italian and English essential, as is extensive experience teaching Italian courses at the university level. PhD or ABD in Italian linguistics, language pedagogy, or related field required.
